# How'd we come up with our program?

As experienced and university trained teachers, we've taken everything we know about...

### What does the program look like?

It's exactly the same format as our educational program. Our educators still plan interest focussed experiences to achieve specific goals. It's just the goals this time around will be school readiness orientated. Our pre-schoolers also have a specific "school" time, just after lunch at lpm.

### But what even is "School Readiness?"

It's making sure our children are equipped with the skills, understanding, resilience and social and emotional values to be able to flourish is a school-based environment.

Social and Emotional readiness is one of the most important things we're aware of when thinking about "school readiness". School often presents children with new exciting challenges, and a big part of our program is equipping our children with the tools, the independence, the confidence and the drive to overcome them.

The best we can hope to instil in our children is a love and a thirst for learning, which is why we are so passionate about our interest driven, play based learning philosophy.

## How will you teach all this?

Through exciting and innovative learning experiences, derived from the children's interests. Our educators engage in play based learning with the children, and facilitate development through strategic questioning, conversation and engagement.

## What's so different about school?

There're a few unique differences in the school environment which children should become familiar with as they prepare for the transition to school. Some things like...

- Having one teacher the whole day
- Toileting without supervision
- Wearing uniforms
- Transport
- Sitting at a desk
- Navigating a large playground
- Resolving challenges independently
- Seeking out a teacher's help
- Homework

# How do you prepare for that at NELC?

We have specific events, experiences and strategies to help prepare our children. Things like...

- Lunchbox week, where we prepare the children's lunch box and the children learn to ration out their food for the day
- Canteen week. We set up a 'canteen' where the children can 'buy' their lunch
- Uniform week
- Excursions to schools.
- Boy/Girl toilet week
- Lots and lots of conversations
